II-IVs Varsity Match 2024 - Match report



The last outing at Shotover was a difficult day for the club. While our Men's IVs and Women's IIIs managed victories, each selected team suffered heavy defeats. Since then, sustained efforts have been made to grow the size of the club, improve the quality of training (including regular practice at Shotover!), and increase the overall professionalism of our approach. It was therefore all the more special to achieve five victories out of five at Shotover this year, amidst record participation in the Men's and Women's Mob Matches.

In the selected team races, only two Cambridge athletes beat an Oxford scorer, and one of them is an Olympian. Oxford had the first seven home in Men's IIs, eight of the first nice in Men's IIIs and the first twelve home in Women's IIIs. Unsurprisingly, some records were broken on Saturday including the biggest Oxford win in the Men's IIIs match and the third biggest Oxford win in the Men's IIs match.

Success was about much more than the top-end performances, and the Mob Match Captains, Sam Day and Tamsin Sangster, deserve huge credit for mobilising so many participants. Before the races, the Oxford committee was somewhat worried about whether the Shotover course would be able to handle so many participants. In the end, 265 athletes completed the Mob Match courses without serious issue. This represented a record participation, 139% up on two years ago, and in the case of the women, 181% greater. There was also a first run-out for our selected Women's IIIs team, ahead of the expansion of women's matches to four in 2025.

II-IVs Varsity thus really was a case of 'excellence for all' made real.

Time capsule

The last few decades have seen a few Oxford clean sweeps in II-IV/Vs – specifically in 1998, 2002, 2019 and 2021. In 1998, Oxford even achieved an 8-0 clean sweep despite the match taking place in Cambridge. However, in this newsletter we cast our net back further to 1975, when, as this newsletter records, there was 'Murder at Shotover'. Under the captaincy of Peter Irvine and Lynne Wightman, the Men's Blues also went onto win this year, completing a clean sweep across all matches.
